Thanks to the efforts of the Colorado State Library, you can now check out a Colorado State Park Pass for free. The pass checks out for a week and gives you free admission to any of Colorado's 42 State Parks. We have two passes. You can reserve - i.e. place a hold on - one of them; the other pass is first come, first serve. Along with the pass, you'll get a backpack that includes a directory of the state parks, a couple quick reference field guides, and a pair of binoculars.
