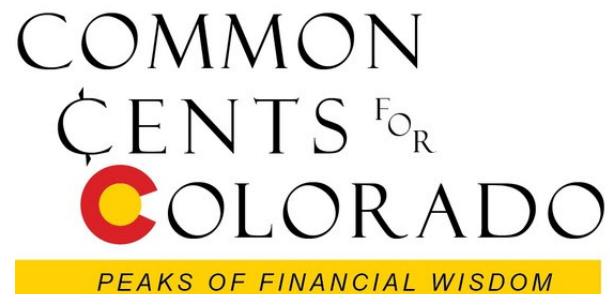


Financial Literacy Workshops

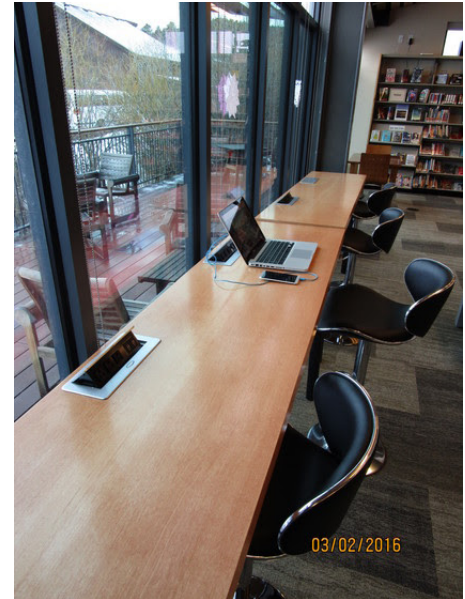
Tea, scones and games will be provided, and participants are encouraged to dress according to the time period (now 1925). This event is free and open to the public.

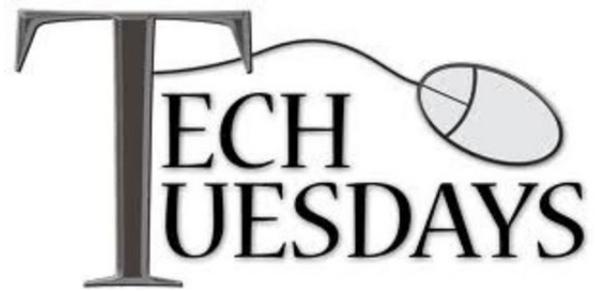
