Jane Wodening - Author Talk on Wolf Dictionary

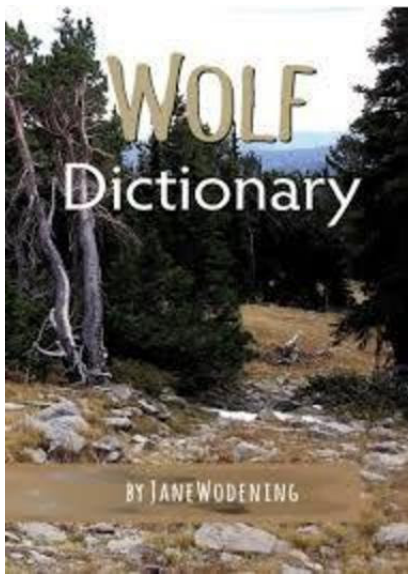

Mango can be accessed at the library, remotely, or even on-the-go with apps for iPhone®, Android™, Kindle® and Nook®.

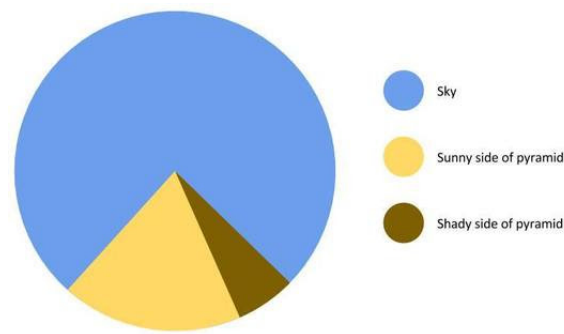
