






In this imagined prequel to Dickens's A Christmas Carol, we find out that Jacob Marley was an unsavory character already when he and Scrooge met as boys.


A solar system of swordplay, cutthroat politics, and lesbian necromancers; a heart-pounding epic science fantasy.

By W. Bruce Cameron



By Shannon Pufahl


A lonely newlywed and her wayward brother-in-law follow divergent and dangerous paths through the postwar American West, this is a story of love and gambling, a powerful debut novel.

By Kinley Roby



By Erin Morganstern


A timeless love story set in a secret underground world—a place of pirates, painters, lovers, liars, and ships that sail upon a starless sea.

By JoJo Moyes


