#### Director

Facilities

- o Repainting of Community Room and entrance/foyer completed
- o Carpet in the main library cleaned
- o Halogen art lights replaced with LED equivalents
- o Windows 10 for Circ 3 computer and Youth Services computer updated
- o Mark Pscheid, contracted for snow removal as-needed, out briefly while recovering from a surgery. The high winds cause drifting over and icing of the back entrance, emergency exit and book drop areas. Staff have been helping with keeping things clear and safe.

  - o New Foundation Board members—Christine Arnone and Susan Kelly
  - Holiday Mountain Market –please try to spread the word to visit their booth
  - o Sold 60 Candles at library,
  - o Foundation approved \$3, 275 toward Library programs and an exhibit case, and up to \$10,000 toward outdoor digital sign.

- o New hires are all going very well.
- We are working toward Tom's last date in his current position as March 24<sup>th</sup> and then having him help us out on a consultant basis (he has his own IT consulting company!).
- Programming and Experience Passes
  - o Mike applied and received grant support for a Kids Coding Club to being in January.
  - We had several requests for Experience Passes to the Denver Art Museum's Monet exhibit so we are launching a limited quantity this week.
  - o FDGD—March 14, 2020. Beth Crist, Youth and Family Services Consultant for State Library wants to be our coffin rider!
- Revised and New Policy Adoptions
  - Collection Development
  - o Reconsideration of Materials
  - o Grant-Acceptance Policy

#### Treasurer

- As of October 31, 2019, checking/savings totaled \$298,805, of which we have \$12,667 in Checking, \$286,805 in Savings, \$82,390 in our Reserve Fund, \$50,000 in land development fund, and \$30,000 in our long-term maintenance fund.
- October 2019 total income totaled \$4,274 of which \$1,712 was from total Property Tax Revenue, and \$1,938 was from total Specific Ownership Tax.

- October 2019 expenses totaled \$142,016. Of that, expense categories exceeding \$1,000 were: \$113,640 for Bond repayment, \$4,650 for books and materials, \$1,087 for maintenance, \$1,224 for payroll taxes, and \$15,112 for wages. The Series 2009 GO Bond is now paid off as of December 2019; future bond payments will be Series 2017 at a 2.310% interest rate.
- Net income for October was \$-137,742. Net income year to date is \$45,962.
- Estimates of revenue for 2020: Estimated Property Tax General Fund Revenue is \$349,274.128 and Specific Ownership Tax General Fund Revenue will be \$10,000. Our Bond Redemption amount is \$133,787 with \$5,000 come from Specific Ownership Tax and the remaining from property tax.
- Increased expenses for 2020 approved by the Board at the October meeting:
  - o Increase personnel at 5% to be in line with the Town's COL and merit increases
  - o Increase the full-time Youth Services salary by 10% to bring some parity to what a librarian with an MA would make in Boulder County
  - o A pension/retirement fund for the District's two full-time employees.
  - Budget for 14% more staff time in order to continue our extended hours
  - \$10,000 for new digital sign. The Foundation will pay 50% of the total cost.
  - o Increase budget for water 3% and sewage by 4%.
  - o \$2,500 for Caribou event
  - o \$1000 for welcome packets for new residents in low-income housing unit
